SEXUALITY ACCORDING TO GOD

Genesis 1:27 conveys an undeniable connection between "the image of God" and the ontological categories of male and female. This verse consists of three lines of poetry, with the second and third lines structured in parallel, communicating a correlation between God's image and "male and female." Being created in the image of God and being male or female are essential to being human. Sex (male and female) is not simply biological or genetic, just as being human is not simply biological or genetic. Sex is first and foremost a spiritual and ontological reality created by God. Being male or female cannot be changed by human hands; sex is a category of God's handiwork — his original and everlasting design. As hard as anyone may try to alter this fact in his or her own body, the most that can be done is to artificially remove or augment body parts, or use pharmaceuticals to unnaturally suppress the biological and hormonal reality of one's essence as male or female. In other words, psychology usurps biology; what I feel becomes who I am. When denying this physical and genetic reality, we allow experience to supersede essence, and more importantly, the image of God. —Christopher Yuan

Genesis 1:27 is the first poem in Scripture. In three lines of four Hebrew words each, it lays the foundation for understanding the importance and design of male and female.
