

2 Timothy 1:13-18

Hold Tightly to God's Truth

Make no mistake. We as Bible-believing evangelical Christians are locked in a battle. This is not a friendly gentleman's discussion. It is a life and death conflict between the spiritual hosts of wickedness and those who claim the name of Christ. It is a conflict on the level of ideas between two fundamentally opposed views of truth and reality. It is a conflict on the level of actions between a complete moral perversion and chaos and God's absolutes. But do we really believe that we are in a life and death battle? Here is the great evangelical disaster—the failure of the evangelical world to stand for truth as truth. There is only one word for this–namely accommodation: the evangelical church has accommodated to the spirit of the age. Truth carries with it confrontation. Truth demands confrontation: loving confrontation, but confrontation nevertheless. If our reflex action is always accommodation regardless of the centrality of the truth involved, there is something wrong. —Francis Schaeffer, The Great Evangelical Disaster (1984)

2 Timothy is Paul's final exhortation to Timothy. Facing death, Paul exhorts Timothy to not give into fear and to not be ashamed of the gospel of Christ nor of himself, Christ's prisoner. Instead, Timothy needed to stand strong in the faith as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.
