## INTERCESSION According to GOD

The main importance of this incident is in the wonderful picture of Abraham's intercession... The friend of God is compassionate even of the sinful and degraded. Abraham did not intercede for Lot, but for the sinners in Sodom. He had periled his life in warfare for them; he now pleads with God for them. Where had he learned this brave pity? Where but from the God with whom he lived by faith? How much more surely will real communion with Jesus lead us to look on all men, and especially on the immoral and outcast, with His eyes who saw the multitudes as sheep without a shepherd—torn, panting, scattered, and lying exhausted and defenseless! Indifference to the miseries and impending dangers of Christless men is impossible for any whom He calls not servants, but friends.

## THE OUTCRY AGAINST SODOM (18:16-21)

The Lord reveals His plans to Abraham.

The secret counsel of the Lord is for those who fear Him, And He reveals His covenant to them. (Psalm 25:14)

The Lord reveals the outcry against Sodom and Gomorrah.

When He avenges blood, He remembers them; He does not forget the cry of the afflicted. (Psalm 9:12; cf. Gen. 4:10)

The Lord reveals the full knowledge behind His judgment.

He judges the world with righteousness; He executes judgment on the nations with fairness. (Psalm 9:8) Theological traditions have noted a special designation for "sins crying to heaven" ... Sins committed against helpless, defenseless, or innocent people; sins of oppression or injustice more generally; or sins against "the helpless, strangers, widows, orphans, the poor, the enslaved ... who cannot help themselves and therefore cry out to God that he would intervene."

**Outcry**. Hebrew, ze'aqah, "a cry, esp. that which is an expression of sorrow or the cry for aid" (cf. Ex. 2:23; Jud. 3:9; Prov. 21:13).
